### STREAMLINE THE PATH TO CITIZENSHIP

The citizenship process is full of hurdles. Even after living in Basel for years, a pre-requisite for citizenship, an applicant still must pass a language test, a knowledge test, and a naturalization interview. Then there are the high costs. For those with a good income and education, it is difficult, but doable. For those without extra money, without a higher education, who do not test well, and for the younger applicants, it can be very difficult to overcome these challenges.

We want everyone who lives in Basel to be able to contribute to community decision-making and to make the naturalization process more straightforward. Children should not be forced to pay for their naturalization, and the language courses and preparation courses required for the process should be available without charge. We believe that the naturalization interview is unnecessary in its current form, but so long as it continues to be required, it should be more open and welcoming to our prospective citizens.

### **IMPROVE WORKING CONDITIONS**

The Bürgergemeinde is also an employer. More than 1700 people work in the Bürgerspital, in the Bürgerlichen Waisenhaus (oder Basel Children's Home als Übersetzung), at CMS, or in the forestry service. Especially in the current crisis, when life is becoming more and more expensive, significant pay increases are needed. Furthermore, we will work to hire more nursing staff and care workers in order to help reduce the strain placed on employees.

### **BÜRGERGEMEINDE FOR ALL**

Only one in three people who live in Basel are allowed to take part in the election for the Bürgergemeinde Council. It is not enough to be an adult citizen living in Basel; one must also separately obtain Basel citizenship.

We think this is outdated. We want the Bürgergemeinde to include all residents. Therefore, we want to update the electoral regulations so that all people who live in Basel can participate in the Bürgergemeinde elections. Furthermore, the executive of the Bürgergemeinde should be directly elected, not only the Council.

# **CLIMATE JUSTICE**

In the brutal summer of 2018, every fifth tree in Hardwald died. The climate crisis is at our doorstep.

The care of the Hardwald, a responsibility of the Bürgergemeinde Basel, requires adaptation. But we also demand that the Bürgergemeinde and especially CMS to change course and build a climate-friendly neighborhood in Dreispitz instead of concrete, luxury towers.

In addition, just as in the Grossen Rat (oder Cantonal Parliament), we demand the formation of a climate committee, which will ensure the development and implementation of programs to improve social and climate justice in Basel.
